

Rami Saari has published 7 books of poetry in Hebrew, and 56 books (poetry and fiction) translated into Hebrew from Finnish, Greek, Spanish, Catalan, Portuguese, Hungarian and Albanian. His publications in anthologies and periodicals are far too numerous to count. His poetry has been translated into many languages.
